1. Have you owned a dog before? If not, what knowledge do you have as far as raising a puppy and the challenges you may face?

2. Have you owned a corgi before? If not, what research have you done to understand if this breed is a good fit for your home and lifestyle?

3. If you haven't owned a corgi before have you owned a herding type breed? Do you know the tendencies that may be a possibility (nipping, heeling, barking, etc.) that can come along with a herding breed at times and how to correctly curb them?

4. What type of living situation and life style do you currently have? (home in town, home in the country, apartment, etc.) Do you understand the exercise the breed requires?

5. Do you plan to continue the crate training that if already started here? If not, how do you plan to keep the puppy safe while you are away? Do you have adequate areas for exercise to ensure your puppy isn't crated too long as this can cause calcium build up in the body resulting in bladder/kidney stones and thus alike if left too long in the crate for several hours. Corgis are people pleasers and once potty trained will do all they can to wait until you let them out of their crate and/or kennel.

6. Do you have other pets? If so, what are they?

7. Do you have children? Ages? Are they familiar with how to treat a puppy/dog?

8. Do you plan on having the puppy you get from us fixed? If so, will you wait until at least 10 months to a year, closer to 18 months is preferred, to help them grow and mature properly, and eliminate permanent health issues? We know that sometimes this is not feasible in certain circumstances. If not, please explain.

9. Are you purchasing the puppy for yourself? If not, for whom and are they aware of the puppy or the prospect of a puppy?

10. Have you taken the time to research your vet and emergency vets on call in your area and visit with them to properly prepare for your puppies arrival? Do you have any questions/concerns for us?
