

The Trip Home!

- Should enough time be allowed for us to get your puppy/dog in for a final vet exam – a health certificate will then be included in your envelope that we provide with you to take home.
- You will also be provided puppy-food/dog-food to travel with your puppy/dog, and also enough feed for you to adjust your little one “mixing in ” with your current feed for his/her first week. We will include supplement/vitamins that your puppy/dog are currently taking to continue on for a few days after arrival until you are able to acquire and/or continue the immune system and vitality supplement/vitamins for your puppy/dog.
- Your puppy's/dog's vet records, health certificate, and pertinent information regarding your new bundle of love and their care will be in the manila envelope handed to you.
- We recommend you bring a small harness size appropriate for your new puppy/dog along with a leash to ensure their safety - should you decide to take him/her out and/or hold him/her in your arms. Having your puppy/dog safely harnessed with a leash attached will provide a safe and happy experience for both you and your puppy/dog.
- We ask that you help prepare your trip home with a small bottle of “spring water” and a dish to share a drink once in a controlled and quiet area to offer your puppy/dog. Don't be nervous if they don't drink till they get home and have rested quietly.
- Bring with you a small container/bag of baby wipes/towelettes, small plastic bag, paper towels, and/or a warm dry towel which will be helpful in case of any spills, accidents, and/or for cuddling. We know this is an exciting time for both you and your puppy/dog and you may want to hold and/or cuddle your puppy/dog in a safe and quiet area.
- We ask that once you and your puppy/dog is safely at home with you that you take a moment to text/call us to ensure us of their safe arrival. Thank you!
- The first few days with you and your new puppy/dog is a crucial bonding time – we prefer that you take this time to let your puppy/dog adjust to the new food you plan on feeding by slowly mixing (our food that we sent with your new baby) in daily along with bottled spring water mixed with your water to help them acclimate easier and adjust appropriately. A slow transition is extremely helpful.
- During your first few days of bonding time it is very important not to have friends and/or family over. This is your time for you and your puppy/dog to get to know you and/or your family. Take this time to let them recoup from the drive and also adjust to the surroundings, environment, and to you and/or your family.
- Do not take your puppy/dog to public areas and/or set your puppy/dog down on the veterinarian's office floor, exam room, chairs, rugs, etc... as they are susceptible to viruses and unfamiliar bacteria – especially when adjusting to a new environment. Their immune system may be suppressed during the adjustment period and you want the best start for them in their new home.
- During the adjustment period 3 to 4 days after arriving home – your puppy/dog might experience upset tummy, anxiety, and over exhaustion from the drive. Please allow your puppy/dog to rest and/or sleep as much as possible – giving them ample amounts of water and food the first few days. Adjusting them slowly to a new schedule is better applied after the 3rd day of arrival when they have recouped from their travels and are well adjusting back to their old self. Please call us regarding any questions and/or concerns you may have. We as a breeder are here for you 24 x 7 and want the best for you and your puppy/dog.
- Your puppy/dog has currently been taking NuVet Plus (supplement/vitamins) to help build up their immune system and give them a great start in life as well as increase longevity. We ask that you purchase this ahead of time and to continue on throughout their lives to give them optimal health and wellness. - Your puppy's/dog's current feeding schedule is 1 cup of feed morning and evening. Please adjust this amount as your puppy/dog matures and grows. Depending on what you plan to feed, please carefully follow the instructions on the back. Keep in mind when your puppy/dog becomes the age of 6 to 10 months you may have to properly gauge your puppy/dog appropriately to prevent obesity and/or any health issues. Corgis are very prone to being overweight and love to have as much food as they can stomach. Please be careful when your puppy reaches adulthood (1 ½ to 2 years of age) that you watch and prepare to properly feed your puppy/dog with good habits of not overfeeding. This is very important for the longevity of your Corgis health.
